

On Saturday 20 June, the Avenue welcomed the Cairns Chapter of the military motorcycle club the Patriots. More than 120 rode from Cairns via Mareeba and Tolga to the Avenue arriving just after 4pm. Since the opening of the Avenue in 2013, the Patriots have made the pilgrimage to the Avenue to commemorate its birthday and to honour the fallen. A short service was held at the Memorial and Honour Board, and a donation of \$4050 was presented. The Patriots stayed the night in Yungaburra and enjoyed the hospitality of the Lake Eacham Hotel. WALK OF HONOUR

Mates 4 Mates Ambassador and paratriathlete Mark Urquhart completed a ride from Townsville to Ingham then up the range to Yungaburra to finish at the Afghanistan Avenue of Honour – a total of over 350kms. Mark was injured in a parachute jump with 3RAR that left him with permanent injuries, confined to a wheelchair and with post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). Updated Plaque - Explosive Detection Dogs (EDD) and Special Operations Military Working Dogs (SOMWD)

As part of the Remembrance Day Memorial Service, a replacement plaque was unveiled by EDD Handler's SPR Daniel Somerville (with EDD Jemma) & SPR Sean Weston (with EDD PJ) from 3 Combat Engineer Regiment, Lavarack Barracks Townsville. The dogs were a great hit with the crowd, especially for the children who were able to pat and interact with them.

After the service, the handlers presented two framed photographic collages of the 6 EDD and 4 SOMWD that were killed in Afghanistan to Yungaburra Hotel publicans Alf and Margaret Zeller (pictured below with SPR Daniel Somerville, SPR Sean Weston and Craig Reedman). Alf and Margaret will display them in the hotel. Special mention must go to Avenue Committee Member John Hardy for organising the plaque and the attendance of the dogs and handlers.


